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Use these simple steps to unlock any text.

| Name it: It's an article! Read the title: What is this article going to be about? Look at the text features Think about the text structure the author is using to organize the article Mark places to "stop and say something" in your inner voice Read closely | Name it: It's a <i>biographical</i> article! Read again, this time CLOSELY Think about MOOD, noticing words that show <i>feeling</i> Think about FORM; notice number of stanzas, lines and line breaks, rhyme, etc. |



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
